Participants will help define how the Collaborative can further sustainability by considering the following: What services, information, coordination or tools are needed to help ports, shipping companies, shippers, and agencies to understand current economic, environmental, community challenges, and collaborate to promote and support solutions that are tailored to each port/stakeholder while enhancing cross-Pacific coordination and benefits to stakeholders and the environment. For example, different stakeholders need different resources to address unique aspects and challenges. The objective is to discuss how to provide resources that can be used to assist the varied needs and priorities of each stakeholder. Key needs to discuss may include:

- ✓ Information center of excellence: Web-based or other access to the latest information about resources on environmental planning, impacts and benefits, best practices, use of technologies and experience, human and ecological health impacts and strategies to minimize impacts to the environment, economics, and community/health.
- ✓ How to resources and guidance: inventory and other methodologies, studies, models, calculators
- ✓ Networking community: Outreach, education to key partners or stakeholders, with real time access to peers/experts for consultation
- ✓ Latest research and development
- ✓ Capitalizing on Regional consistency to reduce costs and increase benefits
